ADJUSTMENTS

To adjust the Forward Cant of your holster:

- First loosen the top left screw on the Belt clip.
- Next remove the top right screw and pivot the Belt Clip to allow you to move the rubber washer and post to the next hole.
- Reassemble the post into the Holster with the rubber washer on top of the holster between the clip.
- Next tighten the screws.

TO ADJUST THE RETENTION OF YOUR HOLSTER:

- Tighten or loosen the Retention screw to compress the Rubber spacer. Do not overtighten.



MAINTENANCE

Like any piece of quality equipment, regular maintenance is recommended. Clean the inside of your holster periodically with a silicone cloth and check fastening hardware to ensure they are tight. Feel free to use some Blue LokTite on the screws.

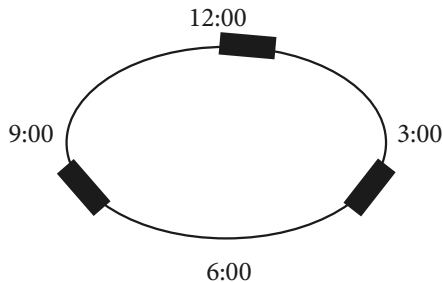

HOLSTER LOCATIONS:

Proper body location is key to Inside the Waistband Holster carry and comfort.

Your Hips are the widest at 3:00 and 9:00. Your pants will be the tightest in those locations. Not great for IWB Carry. You are up against Hip Bone. Slightly behind your hip is a natural pocket for most people. The 3:30 to 4:00 position allows for most people a comfortable location to carry. 8:00 and 8:30 for Left Handed people who carry lefty.

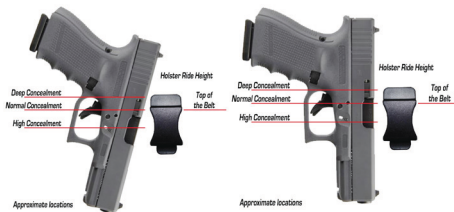
Up front in Appendix Carry is from 12:00 to the 2:00 position for a Right Handed person. The closer to center line you carry the more you are able to use the natural crease to your leg. We like to be in about the 12:30 position. Just right of center line. The closer to 3:00 you carry, the more the Grip will have a tendency to print and the muzzle will impede your hip area.



HOLSTER CANT:

When carrying IWB Holsters behind the Hip area. It is important to have the proper grip angle for the handgun to be in the proper position for a good full hand firing grip when drawing the handgun from the holster. A 15 degree forward cant provides a good angle to access the grip with the proper draw position. This places the Grip in a slightly forward angle to allow your hand and wrist to be at a natural angle when grasping the grip for a drawing motion.

When carrying a holster in the Appendix Carry location, up front a Straight Cant is needed for the proper wrist position. A forward cant in this position will put your wrist at an unnatural position to draw from. A Zero degree cant allows your hand and wrist to be positioned for a good full hand firing grip. A reverse cant angle is not good in this position, as it will make the handgun grip angle towards the pants or be buried in the pants, resulting in a hidden grip that is hard to draw.



BELTS:

While carrying a handgun, it is important to realize that the use of a proper belt can fix many issues while carrying. A proper belt of sufficient thickness will allow the belt attachments to have a piece of material to bite under. The belt attachments have a hook to attach under the thickness of the belt. Too thin of a belt results in the whole holster being drawn. Not a good thing. Carrying concealed requires a whole system to work together. While we do have Beltless clip options available, most of our holsters have our Fold Over Clip on them. When your belt is at the 3:00 position it is also the least amount of belt material for the clip / holster to attach to. This is where the curve / roundness of the hip make the belt have very little area for attachments to bite onto.

Best carry Practice:

- Always train with an empty handgun to practice your drawing from concealment.
- When re-holstering your handgun, you should always make sure that clothing and material are not getting in your holster or trigger guards area.
- When putting your holster on or off, it is best done with the handgun in the holster. The trigger guard is always protected that way.
